Animal Protection Voters New Mexico State Legislature 2004 Session Scorecard

Welcome to the Animal Protection Voters 2004 Scorecard for the New Mexico State Legislature.

We know that New Mexicans are concerned about animals and appreciate legislative leaders who value the role animals play in our lives. That's why Animal Protection Voters created this scorecard—so that voters across the state can determine if their legislators share their humane values. The APV Scorecard grades legislators based on how they voted on a number of animal protection

bills and memorials introduced during this particular session. A summary of each scored item is listed below.

The 2004 session was limited in its scope, as are all sessions held in even-numbered years. Any bill introduced must be of a fiscal nature, requested by the governor or a bill vetoed by the governor in the previous session. The animals were lucky to have Gov. Bill Richardson call for three pro-animal bills. These all appear on the APV scorecard, as do several memorials. Memorials do not enact legislation; rather they express

the intent of the legislature and are not limited in the short sessions.

While useful, the scores included here provide only one facet of each legislator's stance on animal protection issues. Benchmark issues introduced only during long sessions (in odd-numbered years), such as banning cockfighting, do not appear on this scorecard. Additionally, legislators' actions during committees and behind the scenes also contribute to each bill's level of success.

Animal Protection Items Scored



Antifreeze Safety Senate Bill 50 (Sen. Richard Romero) and House Bill 411(Rep. Joe Thompson). This bill asked that a bittering

agent be added to antifreeze, rendering it bitter and unpalatable. This offers a layer of protection against accidental and intentional poisoning of dogs, cats, wildlife and children. SB 50 passed the Senate by a vote of 23-13; HB 411 passed the House by a vote of 32-28.




Animal Sheltering Services Act Senate Bill 306 (Sen. Mary Jane Garcia). This act serves as enabling legislation for

the Animal Sheltering Services Board, which would oversee and provide guidance to our public animal shelters, train and license euthanasia providers, and address the vast number of unwanted dogs and cats in New Mexico. SB 306 passed the Senate by a vote of 25-2.

This bill prohibits euthanizing a conscious

animal through intracardiac injection, a method considered inhumane. SB 51 passed the Senate by a vote of 34-0 and passed the House by a vote of 49-5. It was signed into law by the governor.

Public Education to study alternatives to animal dissection, such as computer-generated virtual anatomy. HJM passed both the House, 44-0, and the Senate, 34-5. SJM 22 also passed the Senate, 26-6.

Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources and the Department of Game and Fish to study sustainable funding mechanisms for the conservation of wildlife and their habitat. HJM 37 passed the House by a vote of 55-0 and the Senate by a vote of 25-0.



Spay Neuter Awareness House Joint Memorial 79 (Rep. Joe Thompson). This memorial requested the

month of February be declared Spay-Neuter Awareness Month. HJM 79 passed the House by a vote of 56-0.

Scoring Key

Legislators received 20 points for each pro-animal vote and 0 points for voting against the animals. Legislators who were either excused from the floor session (E) or absent from voting (A) received no points.

A = Absent from vote E = Excused from vote

Sponsorship of pro-animal legislation garnered qualifying legislators an extra 20 points for the first bill sponsored.

A note on score for Dissection Alternatives, HJM 8 and SJM 22: While these pieces of legislation are identical, several legislators did not have consistent votes. Legislators voting yes on one and no on the other received only 10 points for that issue.
